

ADDED SERVICES ...

The 1979-80 school year brought a new and much needed program to Hinds A.H.S. Very few high schools in the entire country can boast of having their own health clinic. The program, initiated and directed by Dr. Aaron Shirley of the Jackson-Hinds Comprehensive Health Center, offered many services to students at no cost.

Services included complete physical and dental examinations, and treatment for any minor problems diagnosed. Visual screening for eye problems and lab tests for various types of infections, pregnancy, blood count, and other health conditions were available through the clinic. Immunizations, pap tests,

and pregnancy prevention were also among the services offered. Other services provided through the clinic were health-education rap sessions and individual counseling.

If a student's health needs required specialized attention not available at the clinic, the staff refered the student to the proper source.

The staff personnel included Mrs. Jo Gregory, coordinator; Ms. Kay Killings, nurse practitioner; Ms. Patricia Moore, LPN; and Ms. Liza Mitchel, clerk, and the physicians and dentists of the Jackson-Hinds Comprehensive Health Center.
