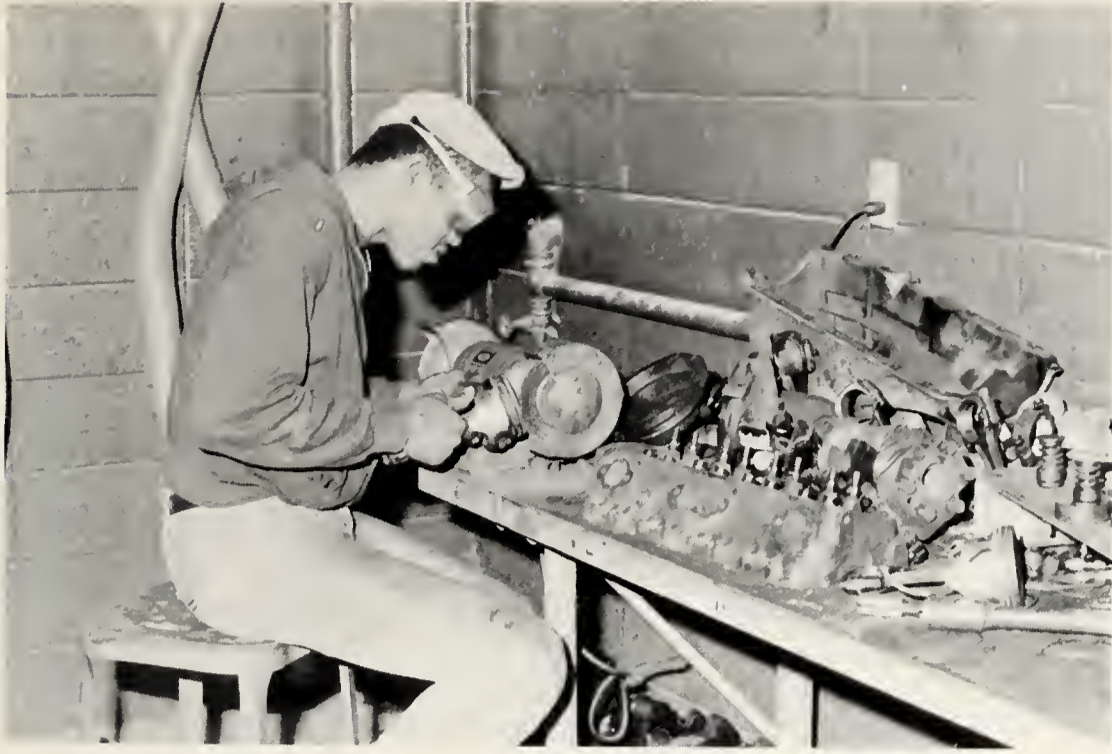

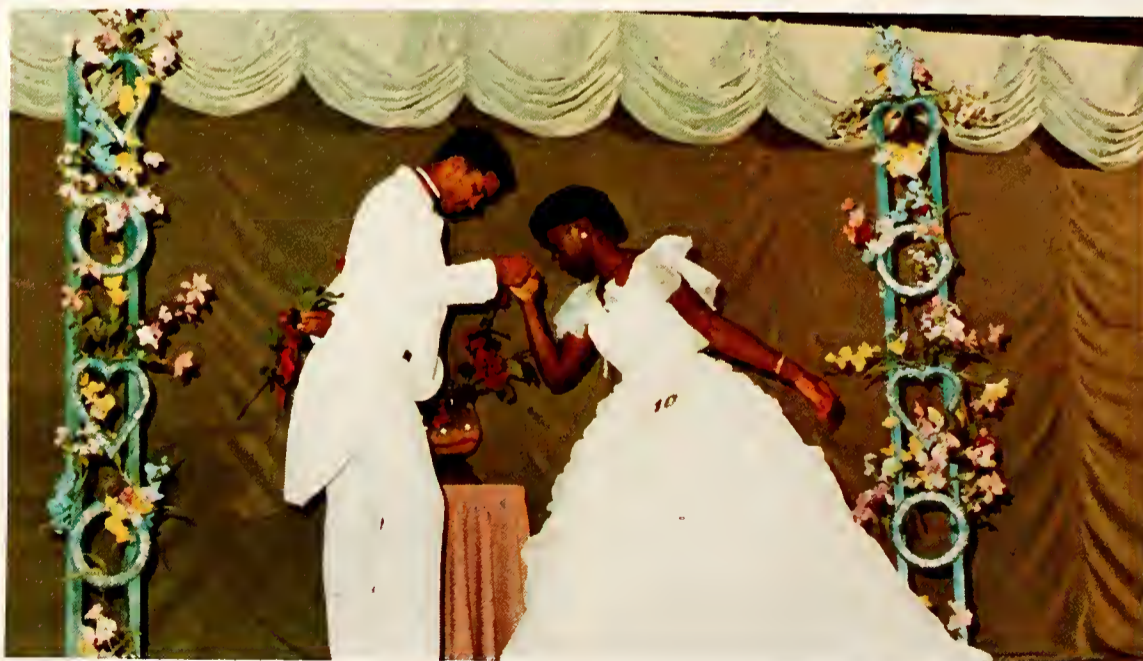
# THE WAY FOR LOVE

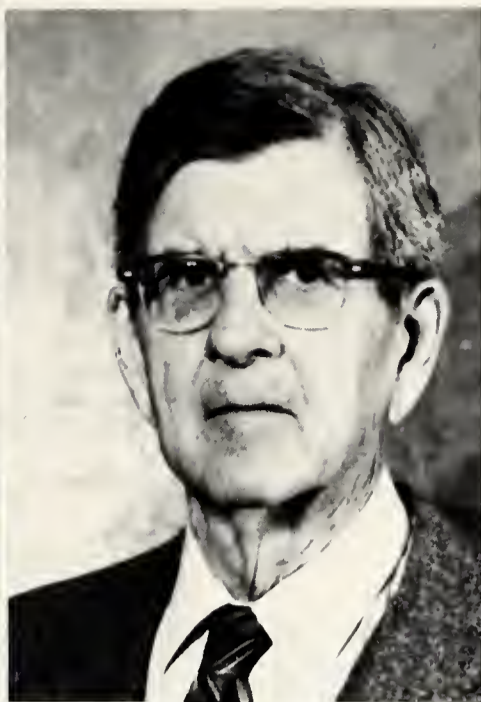

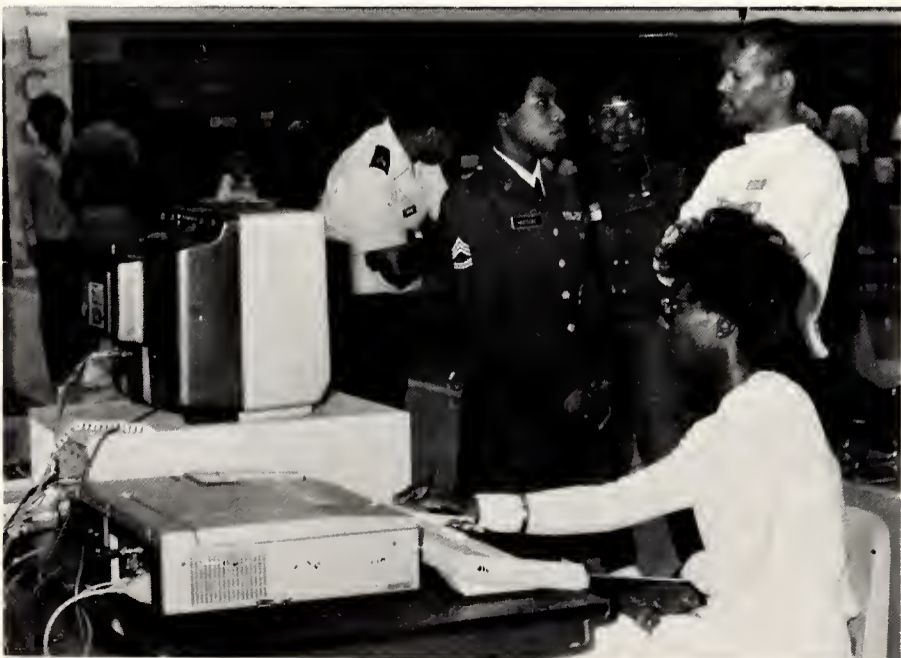

## MEETING THE ADVISORS

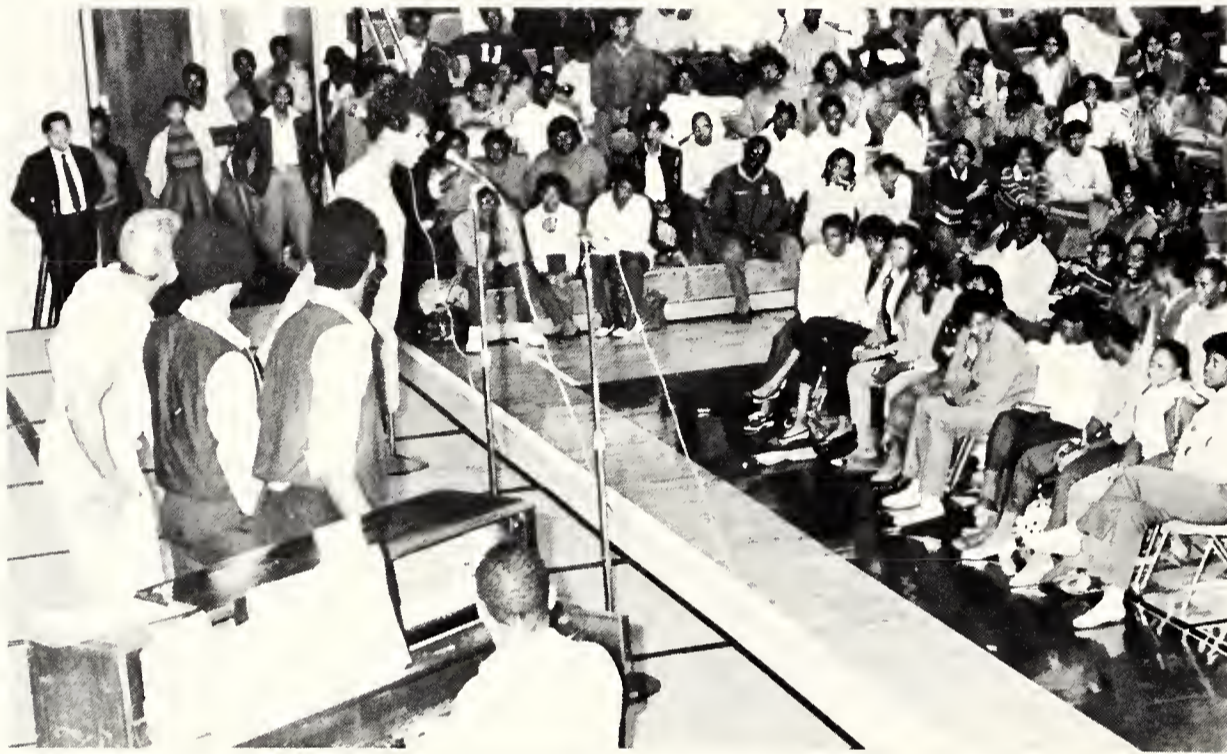

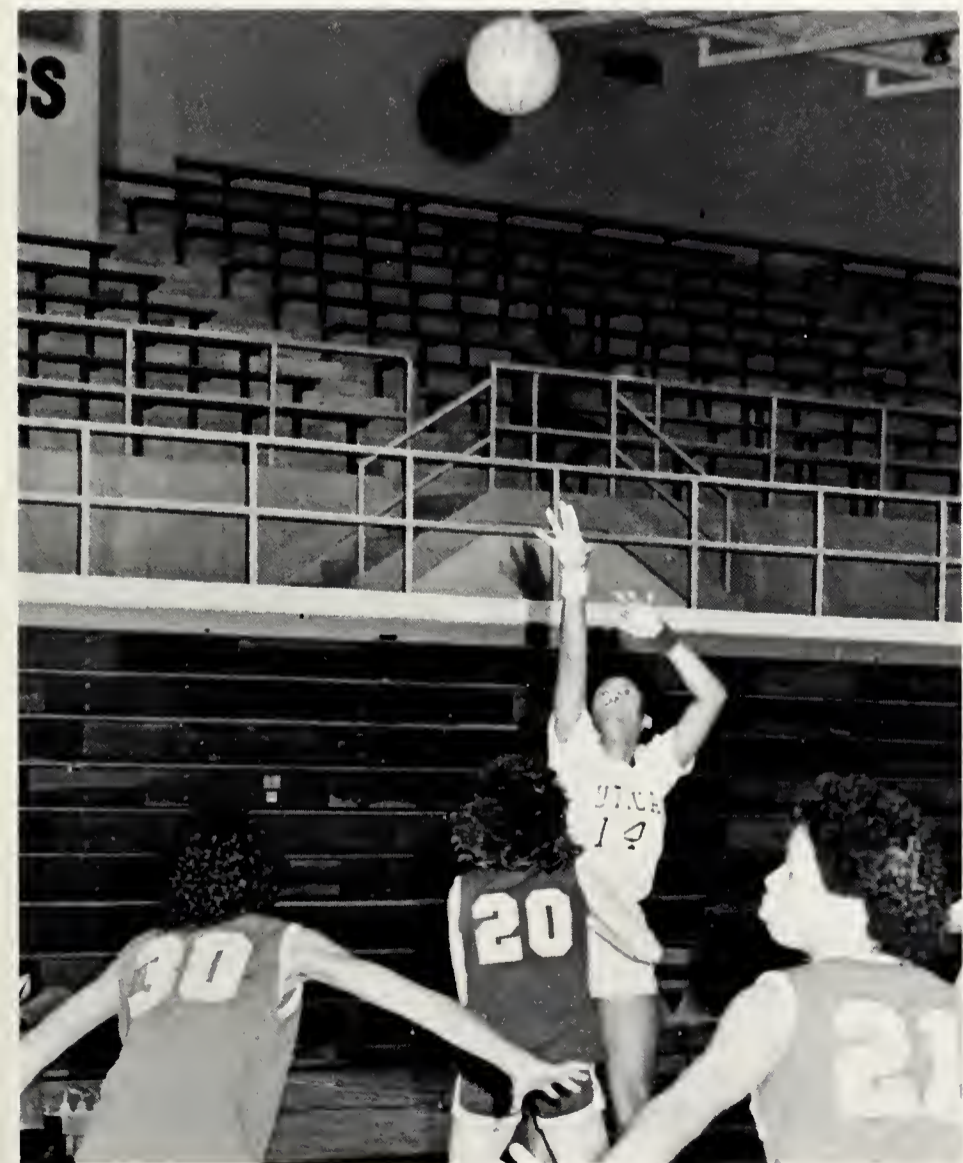

Registration begins in the Registrar's office by selecting a trial schedule.



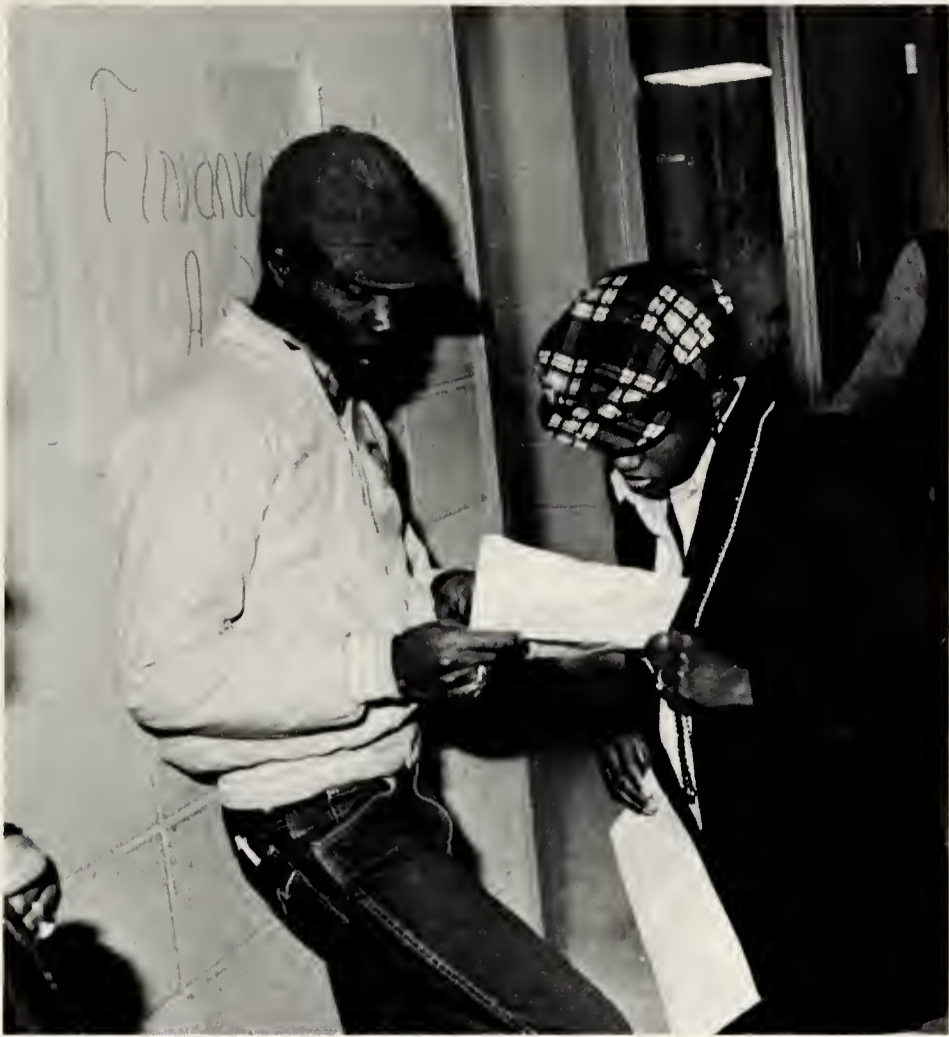
