After working as a teacher in Alabama for a number of years Dr. Holtzclaw migrated to Mississippi. Inspired by the works of the late Dr. Booker T. Washington, of whom he was a student, Dr. Holtzclaw endeavored to establish an institution which would have as its aim the elevation of the Negro vocationally and academically.

A STUDENT MESSAGE

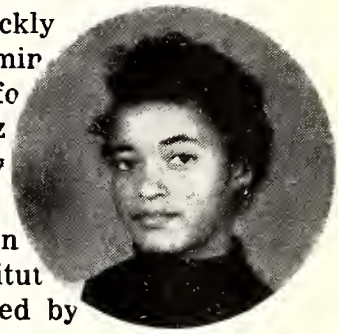
